


- 1 International Development Targets (IDTs) are development targets agreed by world governments at United Nations conferences in the 1990s.
- 2 Pro-poor economic growth is a type/pattern of economic growth that maximises the benefits to poor people by involving them - as producers, labourers and consumers - in the growth process. The degree to which growth is pro-poor depends on two interrelated components, an overall average growth component and a distribution component.
- 3 The 2004 figure is provisional.
- 4 Carbon sinks are reservoirs of carbon taken from the atmosphere and stored over time. These are created by natural processes and include ancient sinks such as oil and coal reserves as well as more transient sinks like forests and coral reefs.
- 5 Estimate - derived using calendar year energy use as the numerator and adjacent March year GDP figures as the denominator.
- 6 The consumption of Chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs) has been prohibited since 1 January 1996. Use since then has been permitted as an exemption for health reasons under domestic regulations for metered dose inhalers for treatment of asthma that contain various CFCs as propellants.

- 8 As reported at the time. Note, this figure would be lower now according to the operational definition of untied aid that is currently in use.

- 13 The significant increase in the average applied tariff on Textile, Clothing and Footwear (TCF) products in 1995 is likely due to a surge of imports from China following the removal of the importing-licensing regime. Most of the increase came from a rise in the import of apparel and footwear, which at the time were subject to Most Favoured Nation (MFN) tariff rates of 30 per cent and above.

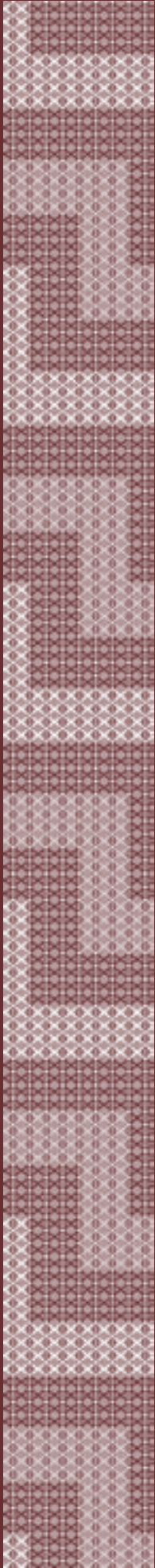
